As we come close to the end of a particularly trying year now is the time to reflect on what positives have come out of navigating the pandemic. We watched the world around us close, Corona virus cases spike, and families distanced what could possibly be upbeat?

Trezevant residents found their way from upgrading the audio/video equipment in the Performing Arts Center, to establishing an investment club and starting a voter registration drive.

Thanks to Emile Bizot's generosity residents now enjoy a state of the art audio/video experience in the Performing Arts Center. Allowing us to stream Disney Plus, ESPN+, Kaleidoscope movies, Sirius XM, Amazon Prime, Hulu, Netflix, Roku, and You Tube. Along with computer presentations and Zoom programming. Zoom presentations include Rhodes College Challenges in World Politics, cooking with the Runaway Spoon's Chef Perre Coleman Magness, and floral arranging with Greg Campbell of The Garden District.

Another way residents have broadened their horizons was with the start of an on campus investment club, Investing for the Future or IFF. This venture was a collaboration of David Edwards and Emile Bizot. The club is made up of residents and employees who meet monthly to propose and discuss investment options. An account was opened with Fidelity, stock purchases were made while the group watches their investments rise and fall.

A group of politically minded residents led by Joan Chesney and Linda Mischke started a drive to get people to register to vote. We quickly learned that we had a lot of talent among our residents and the eleven members of the steering committee. Theresa Mauer, past president of the League of Women Voters, had a lot of valuable information. Perre Magness, a retired newspaper columnist, worked on communication efforts. Fred Wimmer, a retired printer, worked to educate staff via sample ballots. Emile Bizot created educational videos explaining the registration process, featuring some of the young adults discussing the benefits of registering and voting. To round out the group Frankie Wade, Barbara Williams, Lillian Hammond, Jack Richbourg and Mary Edith Walker. Your Voice Your Vote was an initiative targeted at employees to register first time voters. Logo masks and banners appeared around campus and stations were set up over a period of days to promote the right to vote. The committee was successful as several employees were registered for the first time.

Accolades for Trezevant as Allen Morgan and Trezevant Terrace received 2020 Silver National Quality Awards by the America Health Care Assoc. and National Center for Assisted Living. The awards demonstrate a groundwork for excellence illustrating their organizational priorities and goals. Trezevant was voted a favorite in the 2020 Memphis Most. A Commercial Appeal sponsored contest which is voted on by the readers of the newspaper and represent the areas' best. Brighter days are in our future.
